A Day of Hope By Kevin Reynolds, Executive Director

Hope is a very powerful thing. Hope, more than any other thing has the power to change people from the inside out. It is as important as water to a fish, air to a bird, and electricity to a light bulb. --Chuck Swindoll

One of my favorite stories in Scripture is the one where Jesus healed the woman in Mark 5. The Bible says that she had been ill with “a discharge of blood for 12 years, suffered much under many physicians, had spent all that she had, and was no better but rather got worse.” Mark 5:25,26

While there are many stories of miracles and healings in the Bible, what sets this one apart to me, is the role that HOPE played in this healing. A look at the setting of this event shows there was a great crowd following Jesus who “thronged about him”, to quote Mark (vs24).

This woman had heard about Jesus and came up behind him thinking that if she could just touch his clothes then she would be healed; and that is exactly what she did. In the midst of a great crowd thronging about Jesus, many of them undoubtedly touching Him, only one person touched Him *in HOPE*. It was this HOPE that sent the power of God for healing into action. The healing was in the HOPE, not the touch.

What a day that was! And can we even imagine how humbled and grateful she must have been? It was clearly A DAY OF HOPE and, it was such, because of The God of HOPE.

We have had our own DAY OF HOPE this month. May 7th was San Angelo Gives, a day of giving organized and facilitated by the San Angelo Area Foundation. The Lord has been so good to us over these 25 years by providing all that we’ve needed through the generous gifts of faithful friends and partners like you.

We have been able to supplement regular donations with seasonal fundraising efforts over the years such as: Golf Tournaments, the Summer Hoop Shoot, and Christmas Gift Sponsorships, making it possible to faithfully reach nearly 2,000 children and youth weekly with the Good News of Jesus.

While we have had to make adjustments to our programs from time-to-time due to fluctuations in giving and expenses (especially during the summer months), our entire history has been one of month-to-month prayer, trust, and HOPE.

San Angelo Gives has certainly become A DAY OF HOPE where we reach out to friends and partners and have been both humbled and grateful beyond what words can convey. While we are careful not to presume anything of The Lord or His people, this one day has become critical to our yearly efforts serving as a source of a good percentage of our overall funding for the year. Such is the case this year. After amplification and prizes we received \$123,852.66 in donations from partners through San Angelo Gives.

These precious gifts on that DAY OF HOPE will be prayerfully used throughout the year as we continue “Taking JESUS to neighborhood children, youth and families.”

Thank you so very much for all your support. We love and cherish each and every one of you. Our prayers for you echo words of Paul in Romans 15:13: “*May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in HOPE.*”

May the God of HOPE bless and keep you in Him!
